




Albrecht Von Wallenstein, generalissimus of the imperial forces and one of the greatest generals of Thirty Years' War, was murdered inside this very building on 25th February 1634. The museum that focused on the items connected to the person of Albrecht Von Wallenstein from the end of the 19th century is proud to present the largest collection of personal belongings of the duke of Friedland. His épée and two ceremonial riding saddles, lace collar and his riding boots with spurs, are among the most valuable. There is also the murder weapon, which the duke had been impaled with by captain Walter Deveroux. One more unique object is the mounted taxidermic horse, who was slain in the battle of Lützen in 1632 and had been Wallenstein's favourite.
















Cheb Museum is the largest museum in Carlsbad region, counting the extent of collections. It was established in 1873 and then opened to the public a year afterwards. Modest premises were found in the rear part of Pachelbel's House (also known as Town House) – one of the most preserved medieval patrician houses in the town.

One of the most prominent exhibits displayed in the museum is, without a doubt, the Cheb antependium used as a decoration in front of an altar. A rare embroidery, created most likely by Cheb's Poor Clares and dated around 1300, is one of the most prominent relic of artistic handiwork in the Bohemian region. The exhibition is also refined by the oldest dated bell in Czech lands, collection of gothic statues, examples of Cheb's baroque rifles and rare set of ivory carvings, depicting the most prominent characters of Thirty Years' War – so called Hallwich's collection. One can also visit the renowned tile stove of Willibald Russ in Cheb Castle with the imagery of local folk traditions.









The homestead is located near the church of St. Simon and St. Juda in the hamlet of Milíkov. It features a classical platform of Cheb's half-timbered farmhouse with a square barnyard. The house, which dates back to at least the 18th century, includes a residential building with a shed and a barn dated to 1781, open shanty and a modern "altenteil". The residential house has a half-timbered upper floor with a porch facing the yard. Visitors may view the historic interior of the farmhouse, supplemented with household, craftman's and agricultural tools and even some small farm machinery. The farmhouse is registered in the Central list of cultural heritage of the Czech Republic.
